## **KLEF History**

1954	KLEF Incorporated & First Mr. KY Basketball Announced (Vernon Hatton)
1958	Lions of Kentucky adopted the Foundation as a state project.
1976	First Miss KY Basketball Announced. (Donna Murphy)
2002	Vision Van was put on the road to provide vision screenings throughout the state after raising \$153,000.
2004	KidSight program was launched to screen pre-school aged children for vision problems.
2011	The KidSight program purchases the first SPOT digital camera.
2012	KLEF hosts 1 <sup>st</sup> annual Mr. and Miss Kentucky Basketball Awards Ceremony in Louisville, KY.

KLEF adopted our new Mission, Vision, Motto and Core Values. The KLEF By-Laws were revised and new Executive Director, Lindy Lamkin was hired.

**KLEF** celebrated 65 Years of Service.

KLEF kicked off our State Tour & introduced our 20/20 Club.

KLEF hosted our first-ever Virtual Mr. and Miss KY Basketball Awards Ceremony in June 2020.

KLEF received a \$75,000 grant from the Louisville Downtown Lions Club to help fund the purchase of a new Vision Van and screening equipment.

KLEF launched its monthly "Ask the Expert" educational series, during which we virtually interview experts on various topics to educate our constituents about eye health, vision impairments, and other important topics.

Several KY Lions Clubs celebrated their 100<sup>th</sup> Club Anniversaries, including Paducah, Louisville Downtown, Owensboro, Mayfield and Lexington.

KLEF staff worked remotely for much of the calendar year due to the COVID-19 pandemic to ensure continued execution of our programs and services. KLEF Trustee meetings were also conducted virtually to protect the safety of everyone. KLEF staff continues to work remotely due to the COVID-19 pandemic to ensure continued execution of our programs and services.

KLEF hosted our 2nd Virtual Mr. and Miss KY Basketball Awards Ceremony in April 2021.

KLEF volunteers and staff returned to the Kentucky State Fair to provide over 1,700 FREE vision screenings throughout the 11 days of the Fair in August.

In September, KLEF received our 2021 Ford Transit Van that was ordered in February 2021 that will be our NEW Vision Van. Graphic designers are now working on creating the wrap for the van and it will be up-fitted on the inside to hold the equipment.

KLEF's Cooking for the Cause Cookbook is now available to purchase – as of September 2021. Individual books are \$20 and Club's can purchase books in bulk (over 25 books) for a discounted price of \$10 per book. Club's can sell these books as a fundraiser for their own Club. Book has over 120 recipes!

## **KLEF Service Programs**

### **Holloran Trust Fund**

- The Holloran Trust Fund, which was established in 1967, assists low income legally-blind individuals from Bullitt, Hardin, Jefferson, Oldham, Shelby and Spencer Counties in Kentucky and Clark, Floyd and Harrison Counties in Indiana.
- Requests for help will be considered by a committee of Lions Club members who have been selected to manage the Holloran Trust Fund under the direction of the Kentucky Lions Eye Foundation.
- The Holloran Trust Committee meets every other month to go over any applications received.

## KidSight

- The Kentucky KidSight Program is proud to be part of the Lions Club International's KidSight USA Program.
- The Kentucky KidSight program is a vision screening program started by the Kentucky Lions Eye Foundation in 2004 in which Lions Clubs and volunteers throughout the Commonwealth organize and conduct vision screenings for children ages 6 months to 6 years old.

## KidSight

So far during the 2021-2022 Fiscal Year, a limited number of KidSight screenings have been able to be conducted by KidSight volunteers due to COVID-19 guidelines and restrictions. But, we have made some of our Spot Vision Screener devices available to a few health clinics to conduct screenings, and some Clubs have completed some screenings as well.

We hope to be able to conduct more screenings soon, when we are able to more safely do so while following all guidelines to protect the safety of children and volunteers.



### **Patron Program (Surgery Assistance)**

- The Patron Fund Program was created to help those Kentuckians with no insurance or limited insurance to obtain medically necessary eye surgeries and/or procedures.
- When KLEF receives an application the information is sent to our Patron Committee to review and vote on approval.
- The Patron Program is funded by donations made to the Patron Fund. Interest earnings from the Patron Fund are used annually to provide financial assistance for eye surgeries through the Patron Program.
- We have three recognition levels for those who donate to the Patron Fund.
  - Life Patron \$100 Donation Donor or honoree receives a Life Patron Pin and is permanently considered a Life Patron.
  - Silver Patron \$500 Total Donation Donor of honoree receives a Silver Patron Pin and is permanently considered a Silver Patron.
  - Gold Patron \$1,000 Total Donation Donor or honoree receives a Gold Patron Pin and is permanently considered a Gold Patron.

### **Patron Program (Surgery Assistance)**

 Kay from Hazard, Kentucky is a recipient of assistance from the Patron Program. She was in need of an iris transplant, which was not covered by her insurance. KLEF helped to pay for this surgery and her vision is now back to normal.






After: Iris can be seen and her vision is back to normal.

### **Vision Van**

- The Vision Van program is a vision screening program started by the Kentucky Lions Eye Foundation in 2002 in which Lions Clubs and volunteers throughout the Commonwealth provide FREE vision screenings for children and adults at health fairs and other events. Our NEW Vision Van will be on the road later in 2021.
- The Vision Van houses screening equipment which is removed from the van and is required to be used in an indoor environment.
- The Vision Van is ran by volunteers who have been trained to use the equipment.
- Companies and organizations that host health fairs or want to provide vision screenings to their employees, customers or clients can request the Vision Van and requests are reviewed by our volunteer group and fulfilled based on volunteer availability.


## **Candy Days**

- Started by the Past District Governors in 1970 as a project of Lions Clubs of Kentucky.
- Lions Clubs choose various locations to accept donations in return for candy.
- Half of the proceeds go to the Lions Club's charity account and half is sent to KLEF.



## Finis Davis Fellowship

- The Finis E. Davis Fellowship was created to honor the memory of Kentucky's first and only President of Lions Clubs International. PIP Finis served as President in 1960-1961. Then in 1967-68 he was President of KLEF.
- He spearheaded the drive to raise the first two million dollars to build the Kentucky Lions Eye Research Institute, which is now a world-class center, and dedicated his life to Lionism.
- The fellowship is available to everyone, not just Lions, Lioness or Leos. It may also be given as a memorial.






## Finis Davis Fellowship




